Timothy Macklin - Grand Organ

Fantasia in G 'Piece d'Orgue' BWV 572, J.S. Bach (1685 - 1750)

Arabesque (24 Pieces en Style Libre), Op. 31 - Louis Vierne (1870 - 1937)

Prelude on the Gregorian Introit 'Dum clamarem ad Dominum'

J.S. Bach is now generally regarded as one of the greatest composers of all time. His *Fantasia* or *Pièce d'Orgue* (organ piece) in G major, BWV 572, was most likely composed in the early years of Bach's tenure at Weimar (1708-1717). The piece starts in compound quadruple meter (12/8). This movement is dynamic and cheerful, and features complete absence of the pedal. The youthful vigor and digital dexterity of the opening movement transitions to the contrapuntal central section which features five voices. This then leads into a coda which shows close similarities to the final line of BWV 565.

Louis Vierne's *Arabesque* is from his *Vingt-quatre pièces en style libre* (24 pieces in free style), Op. 31, written during the years 1913 and 1914. Vierne was born in Pointers, France in 1870. He remained almost blind his whole life. He studied under César Franck, Charles-Marie Widor, and Alexandre Guilmant. In 1900 he became Organist Titulaire of Notre-Dame Cathedral in Paris. Vierne's music inspired most of the great Parisian organist-composers who followed him, and his music remains central to the organ repertoire. His output for organ includes six organ symphonies, 24 Fantasy Pieces (which includes his famous *Carillon de Westminster*), and the *Vingt-quatre pièces en style libre*, among other works.
